What is Korah? Korah is the largest slum in Ethiopia (over 130,000 people). This means many widows, orphans and rampant disease. Most survive through begging, prostitution and sifting through trash, desperate to find food or discarded metal and plastic they can sell for pennies.

Our Mission: Keep families together and break the cycle of poverty through the truth and love of Christ. We want families to know their inherent worth being made in God's image and to empower them physically, psychologically, economically, socially, and spiritually.

All HFK (Hope for Korah) programs are administered through over 30 Ethiopian staff including: a program manager, social workers, community development workers, nurses, income generation specialist, tutors, teachers, caregivers, daycare nannies, cleaners, cooks, and guards.

Ministries:

- Elder's Home for men permanently disabled by leprosy
- Orphaned and vulnerable children's home
- Medical clinic
- Education empowerment: providing school supplies and tutoring to sponsored HFK children
- Socio-economic empowerment: Job training for sponsored HFK parents
- Berta Breakfast: feeding hundreds of children a nutrient rich breakfast five days a week

Ministry:

FH seeks to walk with churches, leaders, and families in overcoming all forms of human poverty by creating a healthy relationship with God and His creation.



Bridgewater has a relationship with two communities in Guatemala: Cambalam and Xepiun. We first partnered with Cambalam in 2010, and then later took on Xepiun in 2015. Food for the Hungry's goal is to create self-sustaining communities, so our partnership with Cambalam will be evaluated in 2022.

Cambalam and Xepiun are Mayan villages that speak the tribal language of Ixil. A few residents also speak Spanish, the national language of Guatemala.

In all of North & South America, Guatemala has one of the highest rates of malnutrition. In rural Mayan villages, malnutrition rates are as high as 80%. The problem is often not a lack of food, but a lack of proper nutrition & hygiene. Food for the Hungry teaches classes to educate communities and parents on proper nutrition, while helping them to build the infrastructure to support it (i.e. school kitchens to feed the children, distributing water filters to homes, etc.)

Commitments:

Bridgewater is giving \$16,000 annually from the general budget to FH, and over 100 families sponsor a child in the village monthly. This money allows the children to go to school, supports FH staff who work in the villages to educate families on nutrition and healthy practices, enables FH staff to bring spiritual teaching into the school and community and ultimately helps FH to address broken relationships — with God, each other, self & creation - in ways unique to each individual community. We're also committed as a church to send a team annually to the villages to build relationships by working alongside the people of the village.

Our Vision: We partner with and empower the local leaders and national church towards a multiplication of leaders, church planting movements and worldwide missions movements for God's glory. We have progressed from a pioneering stage, through the church building stage, reproduction & multiplication of local churches, and now we are sending missionaries around the world. The vision is that South America will be a sending force for worldwide missions.

Since arriving in 1985, our team has seen over 70 churches started in Arequipa, Peru and the surrounding area. Now, from Peru alone, we have local (national) missionaries in over 20 countries including: India, China, Morocco - Africa, Iraq, Israel, Germany and throughout South & Central America. We even have some in North America. Many of these missionaries are from our church multiplication movement in Arequipa & others come from our churches in Lima.

One local initiative is called PERU 20. The plan is to get the gospel and see churches started and strengthened in all 20 Departments of Peru within 20 years (2011-2031)! The local Seminary that we founded for multiplication of leaders is "nationalized" and moving forward.

Steve and Debi live in Arequipa, Peru and are involved in normal missionary ministries, but also do a lot of traveling because of Steve's position as regional director. He is currently assisting missionaries and national partners in 6 countries: Columbia, Ecuador, Peru, Chile, Paraguay, and Argentina - with plans to expand into more countries.

IGBC India is a multi-faceted ministry:

- Starting with one church in 1972, they have grown to 62 churches in 5 different states. 7 new churches were opened in 2016 alone. Pastors meet monthly for fellowship & training. Some of the churches are self-supporting but many minister in rural areas to a lower class of people, so the ministry subsidizes the pastor's salary either in part or completely.
- Kerala Baptist Bible College trains 60+ students. Upon graduation, many become pastors or church planters in India.
- The Christian English day school is for children in Kerala, with 200 students that include Hindus and Muslims. The school is self supporting except for building projects.

Prayer needs:

- Train students from all over India and see them return to their state or nation.
- The ministry has significant financial needs. The budget in 2022 is \$90,000 lower than 2021 even though the ministry is doing just as much, if not more. Their professors take salaries multiple times lower than what they could make elsewhere. The government is making it hard for them to continue to operate as a Christian organization.

Our Youth and Education Program works with local schools and youth groups to teach students about healthy relationships and sexual risk avoidance. Mission: Since opening in 2015, the Hospital of Hope sees over 16,000 patients and 1000+ surgeries annually in a region of Togo with very little medical care. They are committed to meeting patients' physical, emotional and spiritual needs. A team of trained chaplains prays with patients and counsels families facing difficulties. They follow up with patients in villages and develop disciples through chronological Bible studies. Thousands are given the opportunity to experience the love of Jesus and hear the Word of God through the digital resources the Hospital of Hope offers its patients both in the hospital and in follow up efforts. The medical team utilizes medicine in connecting and establishing open doors in order for our chaplains, missionaries, and local national pastors to reach patients in their greatest times of need.

Mission of the Orphanage: To help local churches meet orphan's needs and help them become disciples of Christ. We believe the biblical family is God's design to train and nurture children. Because of this, up to 8 orphaned children are placed with a family that includes a father, mother, and siblings. The children are selected on the basis of need (no living relatives able to meet their needs) and their ability to fit within a family structure. Bethesda employs national Christian couples who evidence spiritual maturity, are strongly recommended by their pastor and are actively involved in their local church. We have five homes with 36 orphans on campus and two homes with additional orphans housed in the community. We also train and guide people in other communities and countries in beginning or strengthening their own orphan care ministries.

Mission of the School: Jabulane Christian Academy (JCA)'s 260 students in Grades R (Kindergarten) – Grade 7 are comprised of Bethesda's orphans, staff children and students from the community. JCA employs Christian teachers who are growing in their understanding of God's Word as it relates to all aspects of life. The teachers encourage that God-given understanding among their students and challenge them toward a life-long pursuit of truth.

- For our school year. School runs from January November in South Africa.
- As true in the US, the government here is placing more control over what we believe is right and wrong, what we can and cannot teach, and what we will and won't allow children to do. Pray we will have wisdom to navigate this without compromise.

I work for CrossWay International Baptist Church in Berlin as the Director of Student Ministries.
